

Information requirements under the GDPR

Transparency in data collection and use is necessary to enable data subjects to exercise their right to protection of personal data. The General Data Protection Regulation therefore stipulates that data subjects must be informed accordingly about data processing.

A distinction must be made between two cases here:

- 1) Personal data is collected directly from the data subject (Art. 13 GDPR). In this case, the data subject must be informed at the time of collection.*
- 2) Personal data is not collected from the data subject (Art. 14 GDPR). In this case, the data subject must be informed within a reasonable period of time after the data has been obtained, but no later than one month. If the data is used to communicate with the data subject, the data subject must be informed at the latest at the time of communication. If disclosure to other recipients is planned, then at the latest at the time of the first disclosure.*

The information obligations must be fulfilled in a precise, transparent, understandable, and easily accessible form.

3. Purposes and legal basis of processing

With this survey, the German Center for the Protection of Laboratory Animals (Bf3R) at the Federal Institute for Risk Assessment (BfR) is collecting data to identify reasons that have contributed to the reduction in the number of laboratory animals in recent years. This data collection includes a survey to assess the approval process for animal experiments by the stakeholders involved. The results will be used to achieve long-term satisfaction among the groups of people involved in the approval process on the one hand, and a high level of animal welfare on the other. The Federal Ministry of Agriculture, Food, and Rural Affairs (BMLEH) welcomes the survey.

The data from the survey will be analyzed in pseudonymized form and used to prepare a report to the federal government, which will then be published in the form of Bf3R publications.

4. Categories of personal data

We process the following categories of personal data: type of institution you work for, country of affiliation, job title, state in which you work, classification of your field of research.

5. Recipients or categories of recipients of personal data

Your personal data from the survey will be evaluated by BfR researchers in pseudonymized form. Only results from which the details of individual persons can no longer be traced will be published. The original questionnaires will be stored as research data for the purposes of good scientific practice and will only be made available to a limited number of researchers from BfR Department 9 for analysis purposes.

6. Transfers of personal data to a third countries

Your personal data will not be transferred to a third country or to an international organization, nor is this planned.

7. Storage period

After collection, your data will be stored by the Federal Institute for Risk Assessment for 10 years.

8. Rights of the data subject

You have the following rights towards the BfR with regard to your personal data:

- the right to information according to Art. 15 GDPR,
- the right to rectification according to Art. 16 GDPR,
- the right to erasure according to Art. 17 GDPR,
- the right to restriction of processing according to Art. 18 GDPR,
- the right to object under Art. 21 GDPR,
- and the right to data portability under Art. 20 GDPR.

The restrictions in accordance with Articles 34 and 35 of the German Federal Data Protection Act (BDSG) apply to the rights of access and erasure.

You may withdraw your consent at any time with future effect. This does not affect the lawfulness of processing carried out prior to the withdrawal of consent.

9. Right to complain to the supervisory authority
